L. Summary of my Activities and Future Plans

As a student and a researcher, I have made a way from a classic Marxist historical school towards the Cultural History approach. My research interests divide equally between two research fields:

1. The history of ideas, history of the production of ideas, consumption and meaning of ideas, "intellectual history" of the cultures and ideas that kept societies together. The ideas and symbols broke societies up (like the Bolshevik Revolution and Stalin Revolution), new concepts reverberate among

lower circles who became both producers and consumers of ideas. Book publishing and establishment of the institutions of higher education play an important role in the institutionalization of knowledge and social ideas. I was the first researcher who initiated the study of the Soviet Encyclopedias and their institutional arrangements as a knowledge monopolized by state. As a result of my research, the Encyclopedia and personal archives of encyclopedia contributors and department editors became a part of the research tool for researchers of intellectual life in the totalitarian societies. The partial result of my research was accomplished within Encyclopedia Database of the Heidelberg University and is used by every student of the History department. Encyclopedias turned into ultimate and essential source of knowledge, influenced study programs and educational process at the institutions of Higher education. This interconnection is the subject of my current research.

2. History of people and communities, Jewish communities as an example of "travelling communities" – based on emic approach, a look from the inside and analysis of thoughts and deeds of the common folk (small people within a big history frame – memoir literature, archive materials (including personal archives). First part of the project on the Jewish diaspora of Harbin was accomplished within a frame of a research group from the Heidelberg University (History faculty and the School for Jewish Studies) and an international group of researchers from Heilongjiang University in Harbin, China, Heidelberg University, Germany and Far Eastern State University, Khabarovsk, Russian Federation. Currently I involved in the research of the Jewish Diasporas beyond of the Urals – the East Siberia and the Maritime region of the Russian Far East. This research is based on unique sources such as private archives and is a part of academic international cooperation with Russian researches. The preliminary results of the research were delivered as research presentations at the academic conferences and workshops in Israel and abroad and publication of several articles in a high level academic journals. Siberian Jewish communities research won two academic grants: Sefer - Center International Grant for Research on History and Culture of Russian Jewry in different Historical Periods (2019) and Jewish Museum and Tolerance Center (2020). Phenomena of the Jewish communities of the East Siberia and the Far East became a subject for a serious academic research less than ten years ago. Siberian and Far Eastern Jewish communities case study will help to understand the mechanism of adaptation of Jews to local social and economic conditions different from those of the traditional Jewish societies (Poland and Lithuania Grand Principality and the Russian Empire) and involvement of Jews into a local Siberia economic, social and political structures.

In my research I use qualitative and quantitative methods, analyze existing historical documents both from institutional and personal aspects, official ideology manifested in official documents, official and community statistics (marriage status, economic status, etc.), memoirs and diaries (such as personal

archive of Siberian Jewish gold entrepreneur Yakov Frizer), periodicals and reports. Jewish communities of Siberia and the Russian Far East developed completely different from the Jewish communities of the Pale of Settlement in their way of economic and social behavior. The reasons for a "special way" of the Jewish communities of Siberia and Far East were not analyzed neither by Russian nor by Western researches with a big group of unknown sources and documents.

Five-year research activity program:

- Writing at least of two academic articles every year;
- Active participation in the work of the academic conferences relevant to my research interests (with conference proceedings publishing);
- Organization of two subject panels in the frames of academic conferences abroad;
- Publishing a book on the history of the Jewish communities of Siberia and the Russian Far East (materials from local and central archives, libraries and research institutions);
