Examination of Jewish medicine under the Nazi regime in broad historical context of developmental trends in the modern era – secularization processes, development of modern nation state, public health, etc.

Comparative research – Jewish medicine in the Holocaust versus other cases of genocide, development of historiography of Nazi medicine and Jewish medicine. Ethical issues confronting medical staff under extreme conditions such as ghettos and camps.

7. Academic Profile

My unique research sheds light on Jewish medical activity during the Holocaust, in ghettos and camps, and other places under the Nazi regime. I expose previously unknown documents written during the Holocaust by physicians, nurses, and others. My research shows that the Jews, as persecuted victims, independently created medical systems based on modern medical conceptions, unprecedented under extreme, genocide conditions. The documentation left by the medical staff, which I use in my research, contributes much food for thought regarding the central process undergone by the Jewish society during the interwar period, and during and after WWII.
